Our team arrived in Kangundo, Kenya on Wednesday night, May 30th. Joseph, who is the Director of Operations for Garments of Praise in Africa, and Stephen, who is the head of the Shalom Learning Center, greeted us



and took us to the mission house. Throughout the two weeks we were in Kenya, we were able to see the many different ministries Garments of Praise supports and is involved in. I loved getting to know the Kenyan people especially those

I interacted with daily. Maggie and Bondo cooked amazing meals for us every day. Kenny takes care of the grounds and does the shopping among other things. He and his wife

Another school we visited was the Muisuni Girls School. This school is for high school girls and the mission is to educate girls to the glory of God. While there is a tuition cost, many

One of our team members, Peggy Hubbard, gave an educational seminar and we handed out almost 300 hygiene kits. We also handed these out to other teachers and students at Shalom Learning Center. The high school girls were so fun to talk to and encourage. Many of the ones that I connected with are in their senior year and making plans to attend the university in Nairobi to further their education.



My favorite part of this trip was being with the Shalom children. Along with other team members, we taught Bible stories, worshipped with music, and played games with the kids. We taught them some new songs and they taught us some songs in Swahili. On Wednesday we were able to have a field day at the site for the future Garments of

Praise ministries. The land will include a mission house, Shalom school building as well as the tailoring school, and a dormitory for students. At the

field day, we played games with the kids which included lots of running and provided lunch for them. I played soccer with the older students and 'Drop the Handkerchief' with the nursery kids. The kids were so thankful for their lunch and loved the popcorn treat they received. We were also able to bless the children of the neighbor who didn't receive much food to eat.



At the Bridge of Hope Center, we were able to meet and speak with men and women. This outreach center provides a place for people who are struggling with addiction to alcohol, drugs, or other vices to come and speak and pray with someone. There are also several pastors who volunteer at the center. The center is also made available for community activities.
