GOP leadership continues to wait patiently on the Lord concerning the purchase of the land for the Shalom Learning Center. Jeremiah 29:11 For I know the plans that I have for you,' declares the Lord, 'plans for welfare and not for calamity to give you a future and a hope.'

Lindsey Spears was one of the members of GOP's September 2015 team. She was touched by the joyful attitudes of Kenyan children even though many of them are lacking basic items such as clothing, shoes and tooth-brushes. Lindsey will be returning to Kenya this September and will be bringing many things for these children. These items were donated through her place of employment.



Ilowee and Kusha, a Somalia refugee, and her two children, just has her medical shots to get before she can come to America. She has been living in a stark refugee camp while pursuing this nine year dream. Her father put out a contract on her life after she became a follower of Jesus. She was also beaten and put in jail because she shared Jesus.

This is a young man we put through chef school. He is now working as an attachment, which is like apprentice work.



Graduations: Pastor Samuel Jarso received a degree in Theology, and his wife Wagaye a degree in both Counseling and Teaching. Pastor Samuel is senior pastor for the refugees in Eastleigh and Wagaye counsels the women there as well as teaches and counsels young people in the slums. This joyous occasion is the result of a five year effort of Garments of Praise to help "Equip the Saints".

WELL: All three kiosks, selling water in the village of Katwanyaa, are operating and the people love having a well, some have remarked, "We have clean water now just like the towns"

We can hire workers from women's fellowship which would help those who need financial support within our church. Mum, please support us in your prayer and share our vision to those who wanted to stand with our vision.

Grace Wayua Kivaya was born in 2004 and is in grade 6. She is a hard working girl despite her life challenges. She comes from a single parented family. Her mother who had been the bread winner is now bedridden since last year with a serious sickness. The family is struggling to bring food to the table and is under the care of their ailing grandmother. Shalom Learning Center has tried to cover Grace's school fees during the last year while hoping that her mother would eventually be back on feet again, but this hasn't happen. As a result the school fees have continued to accumulate. Be in prayers for God to open doors to provide for her education. She also needs notebooks and a new school uniform.
